

ASSESSMENT

Attendance would be compulsory for lectures, tutorials, seminars and guest lectures. Student work on projects occurs outside of time allocated for either lectures and/or seminars. Individual or group projects will be assessed with marking criteria and submission requirements clearly stipulated, and will be assessed by the relevant lecturer at the conclusion of each course. The mark (%)/ grade (letter) given to individual assessment should reflect a holistic view of the level of academic rigor and performance engaged in by the student.

Grading System for Assignments

The Grading Policy of Napier University will apply to this proposed programme. Student performance will be evaluated by lecturers using letter grades from A to F:

- A = 70 - 100%
- B = 60 - 69%
- C = 50 - 59%
- D = 40 - 49%
- E = 30 - 39% (redeemable fail)
- F = 0 - 29% (fail – repeat)

For modules, an aggregate mark of 40% and above is a pass, as long as none of the component assignments fall below 30%. An aggregate mark of 65% and over in a module is awarded a merit overall.

In order to graduate, students are required to pass all modules. Should a student fail a module or a piece of coursework, they are entitled to one and only one additional attempt – to be capped at 40%.

If the average of all modules across the programme is over 65% the students are awarded a degree with distinction.
