This **international tourism management degree programme** aims to enable students to gain a broad understanding of the development of tourism and have a critical awareness of the issues that underpin best practice in this field. The programme also enables students to meet the changing demands of society and the economy, and develop vocationally relevant managerial skills needed for employment or further study. In particular, students will be able to integrate subject specific knowledge and transferable skills to develop a specialist topic in depth, conduct a research investigation, and effectively report the findings in the Honours Project module.

This international tourism management (cruise) degree programme aims to enable students to gain a thorough understanding of this unique employment area and have a critical awareness of the issues that underpin best practice. In addition, the programme enables students to develop vocationally relevant managerial skills needed for employment in the global cruise industry and the wider hospitality sector. Overnight cruise line field trip and cruise terminal visits will be arranged for students to deepen their understandings of the cruise industry (where possible). Students will also have an opportunity to apply for the short-term internship on international cruise lines, such as Royal Caribbean International, and Kai Tak Cruise Terminal as this programme aims to provide a world class education for those considering the cruise industry as a genuine career choice.



Programme Structure

The two programmes consist of 7 modules (20 credits each, except for Honours Project and Digitalisation and the Visitor Experience with 40 credits). Students who complete all modules (180 credits) will obtain Bachelor of Science International Tourism Management/ **Bachelor of Science (Honours) International Tourism** Management (Cruise). Under extenuating circumstances, students may be eligible to exit from the programme and obtain an ordinary degree, Bachelor of Science International Tourism Management/Bachelor of Science International Tourism Management (Cruise), upon completion of 140 credits (40 credits at FHEQ level 5 and 100 credits at FHEQ level 6, or 60 credits at FHEQ level 5 and 80 credits at FHEQ level 6).

This international hospitality management degree programme is designed to provide a strong vocational theme relevant for a wide range of employment sectors in the hospitality industry. Hospitality embraces a wide range of sectors including: contract catering, hotels, leisure (such as theatres and casinos), licensed retail (pubs and clubs), restaurants and welfare catering. Hospitality continues to be one of the largest growth industries. Its successful management depends on high-quality business skills and the ability to provide consumer satisfaction. This programme aims to equip students with appropriate knowledge and understanding of hospitality and to develop their skills needed for employment or further study.

This events management degree programme aims to develop a range of professional event planning and management knowledge and skills distinctive of an employable, professionally competent international event management practitioner. It develops students' competence in applying appropriate theories and concepts of international event management to practical situations, so that they can be equipped for a career in the festival, event and related service sectors.

Programme Structure

Entry Requirements

Applicants shall:

 hold a Higher Diploma / Associate Degree in Tourism and Events Management / Tourism and Hospitality Management / Hotel Management awarded within the HKU system through HKU SPACE, or other equivalent qualifications granted by a recognised institution;

<u>OR</u>

 (i) hold an Advanced Diploma in Hospitality Management / Tourism and Travel Experience Management / Live Entertainment, Festival and Event Management / M.I.C.E. and Event Management awarded within the HKU system through HKU SPACE, or other equivalent qualifications granted by a recognised institution;

<u>AND</u>

(ii) have 2 years of relevant work experience;

OR

 hold an Advanced Diploma with 2 years of relevant work experience / Associate Degree / Higher Diploma in other related disciplines such as Business, Marketing, Management, Leisure, and Recreation Studies granted by a recognised institution;

OR

4. have a degree of other disciplines granted by a recognised institution.

Applicants from (3) and (4) may be required to take and pass additional module(s), based on individual merit, before the start of the programme.

If the above academic qualification is from an institution where the language of teaching and assessment is not English, applicants shall provide evidence of English proficiency such as :

- (a) an overall band of 6.0 or above in the IELTS (with minimum component scores of 5.5 in all four components: listening, reading, speaking and writing); or
- (b) an overall score of 76 or above in the TOEFL iBT (with minimum component scores of listening 17, reading 18, speaking 20, writing 18).

Mature students (according to University of Plymouth regulation) and applicants with other equivalent qualifications will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Since the teaching of the additional module(s) will start in mid-June, students who are required to take additional module(s) need to apply the programme by MAY 2025. Late applications will not be accepted.



Duration of Study and Award

With full exemptions granted, students can complete the programmes in 18 months. The four bachelor programmes confer offshore degrees carrying the same academic status and recognition as those offered to University of Plymouth's on-campus graduates.

Students are expected to graduate from the registered programme of study upon satisfactory completion of all stated modules and the honours project, and they will be awarded the Bachelor of Science (Honours) International Tourism Management/Bachelor of Science (Honours) International Hospitality Management*/Bachelor of Science (Honours) International Tourism Management (Cruise)/Bachelor of Science (Honours) Events Management by the University of Plymouth.

Teaching Mode

The University of Plymouth and HKU SPACE are jointly responsible for teaching various modules and delivering the honours project through consultations, tutorials and workshops. Plymouth lecturers will fly over to Hong Kong to deliver four modules face-to-face and deliver one module online. Two modules will be taught solely by HKU SPACE teachers. Specialism modules may be taught in weekday evenings and/or weekend daytime. Teaching methods include lectures, tutorials, field trips, guest speaker talks, revision sessions and individual/group projects.

Assessment

All coursework of the programme will be conducted in English.

The mode of assessment for each module is different from module to module but will be generally based on a combination of coursework (including assignments and tests/projects).

Throughout the programme, students will be assessed by a combination of:

- Report Writing
- Case-study assignments
- Oral presentation
- Project
- Tests (open/closed book) if applicable

On Campus Transfer

Overseas study opportunities for a full semester will be available for several students to study in Plymouth with all Hong Kong credits being counted toward the qualification. No additional tuition fees will be applied, however, accommodation, flight and other personal expenses will be on the own expenses of students. Financial subsidies may be available, please consult programme staff for more information.

Further Studies

Upon graduation, students will have developed independent thinking skills, critical analysis of current hospitality and tourism management knowledge. Honours degree students will have undertaken a final-year project which includes data collection and analysis, therefore, students will be well-equipped with research skills necessary for further studies. Graduates with second-class honours are eligible to apply for the Master of Science Tourism and Hospitality Management programme, in collaboration with University of Plymouth at HKU SPACE (Full time: 12 months; Part time: 18 months), and they can enjoy 10% alumni discount of tuition fee.

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Work Placement

Students will have opportunities to voluntarily participate in various tourism, hospitality, event, and cruise related job placements & internship in Hong Kong in order to gain more exposure and polish their customer service skills. Previous students worked for Hong Kong Disneyland, Hong Kong Trade Development Council, Clockenflap Music & Arts Festival, Hong Kong Cyclothon, etc.

Career Opportunities

Our programmes are designed with the vision of developing high-calibre tourism, hospitality, cruise and event managers with an international perspective. Each module is designed to produce graduates who have the skills to function and communicate in the exciting industry, one of the world's fastest growing fields. Learning is enriched through a wide range of activities, in particular professional talks, case study discussions and field trips which blend business management perspectives with local insight. Graduates can also consider working in service industries that appreciate their transferable management skills and aptitude developed from the programmes.

For international tourism management (cruise) programme, the University of Plymouth has strong links with a number of global cruise companies and work in partnership with Celebrity Cruises (RCL), P&O and Cunard (Carnival UK). Currently, there are University of Plymouth main campus students working on-board as guest relations officers, food and beverage officers and in shore excursions departments with both Celebrity Cruise and P&O Cruises.

Tuition Fee

The tuition fee* for the 2025/26 academic year is HK\$110,250, payable over 3 semesters. The tuition fee covers all the fees charged by University of Plymouth, which include application handling fee and assessment fee. The fees for textbook, re-sitting for assessments, resubmission of assessments, and repeating the studies for each module of study are not included. Additional fees of overnight cruise line field trip are not included.

Financial Assistance Schemes

Bachelor of Science (Honours) International Tourism Management/Bachelor of Science (Honours) International Hospitality Management*/Bachelor of Science (Honours) Events Management programmes are accredited by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ). Programme titles and respective validity periods of the accreditation status are at www hkqr.gov. hk. Full-time students are eligible to apply for Hong Kong government grants and low-interest loans, i.e. Financial

Assistance Scheme for Post-secondary Students (FASP) and Non-means-tested Loan Scheme for Post-secondary Students (NLSPS).

Two scholarships (subject to availability) will be awarded by the Rudy Choy Educational Fund under SKAL International Hong Kong to new tourism, hospitality, event and cruise management students with outstanding achievements in their Higher Diploma studies in HKU SPACE Community College/HKU SPACE Po Leung Kuk Stanley Ho Community College. Each scholarship is worth HK\$10,000.
